Plains Midstream Canada provides solutions to logistical challenges in the crude oil and liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) industries. Plains Midstream's goal is to provide value-added transportation, gathering, marketing, storage and terminalling services to its customers by combining the company's strategically located assets with its extensive marketing and distribution expertise.

The company has established a leading position in two main businesses—the midstream oil and LPG industries—operating and conducting business in five Canadian provinces and more than 40 U.S. states.

The company attributes its success to a strong focus on meeting customer needs, operational efficiency and a commitment and adherence to the highest standards of environmental quality and safety throughout the organization. This commitment is shared by the company's leadership and senior management teams, its more than 800 Canadian and United States employees, and more than 400 contractors. Plains Midstream prides itself on having a corporate culture that encourages learning, adaptability, teamwork, leadership and fresh thinking.





Crude Oil Operations

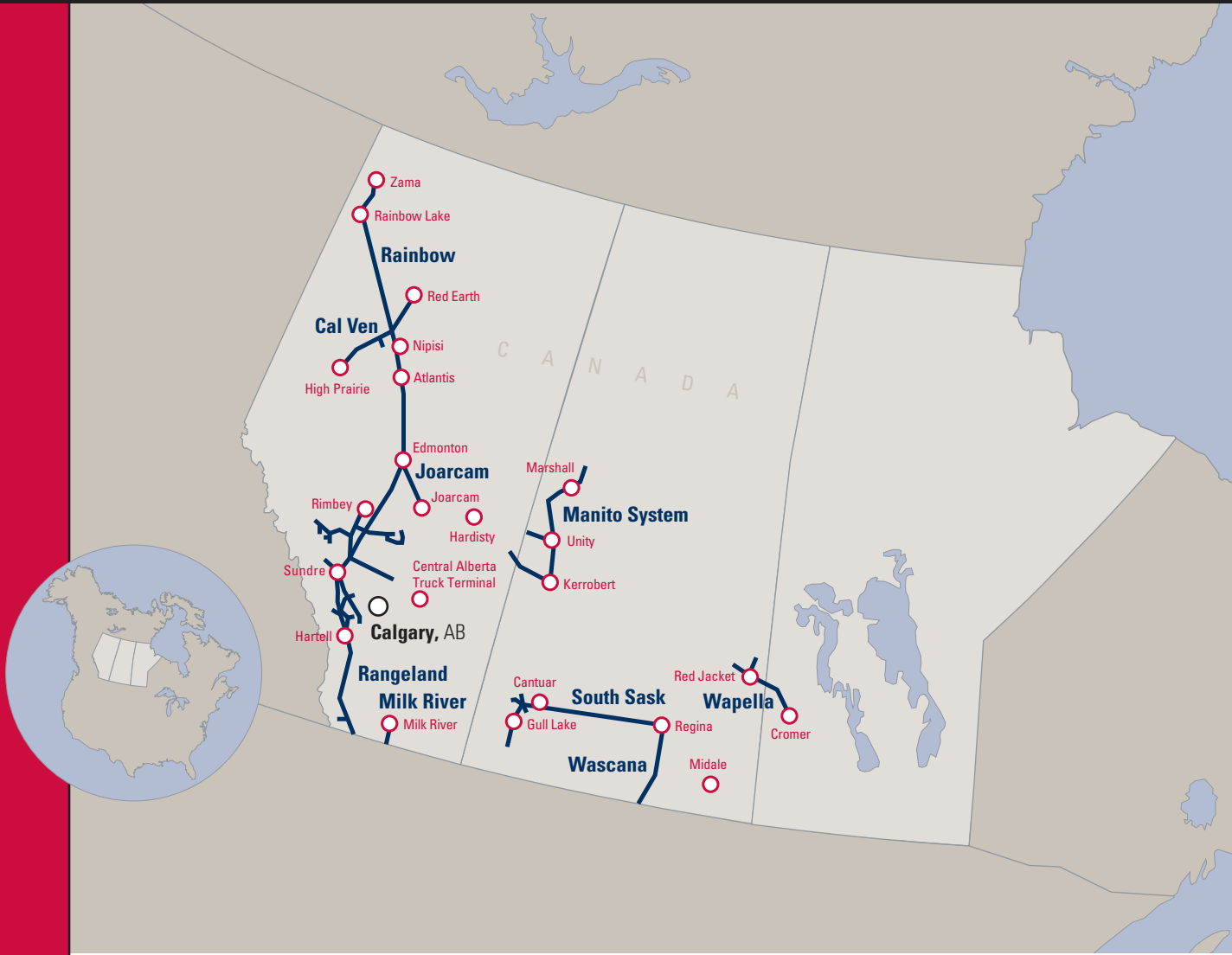
The crude oil group handles the gathering, marketing, storage, terminalling and transportation of various grades of crude oil primarily in the provinces of Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba. Assets include more than 4,800 kilometres of gathering and mainline pipelines systems, 3.9 million barrels of total storage capacity and 17 crude oil truck and rail terminals.

The company's recently renovated control centre at Olds, Alberta, is the state-of-the-art hub of operations for its Canadian crude oil pipeline assets. Among these assets, two primary systems are (1) the Rainbow Pipeline system (throughput capacity of approximately 200,000 barrels per day), that transports crude oil and condensate from Rainbow Lake, in northern Alberta, to Edmonton; and (2) the Rangeland Pipeline system that transports conventional crude oil, condensate and butane to the Edmonton and U.S. markets.

These systems and the company's other assets and infrastructure supports Plains Midstream's gathering and marketing activities such as:

- purchasing crude oil from producers at the wellhead and in bulk from aggregators at major pipeline interconnects or trading locations;
- transporting crude oil on company assets or, when necessary, on third-party systems; and
- marketing crude oil to refiners and other resellers.

Liquefied Petroleum Gas Operations

The LPG group handles the storage, transportation, terminalling and marketing of a variety of liquefied petroleum gases, such as propane, butane and intermediate products. The company's LPG infrastructure includes several terminals, storage assets, fractionation and gas liquids processing plants strategically located across the United States and in Alberta. Maximum storage capacity of the company's LPG assets is approximately 9.4 million barrels.

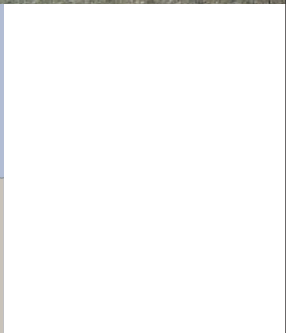
Plains Midstream owns and operates two natural gas liquid (NGL) processing facilities. The one near Bakersfield, California, is a butane isomerization, hydrotreating and fractionation facility and the one near High Prairie, Alberta is a fractionation plant. Combined processing capacity of these two facilities is approximately 28,000 barrels per day.

This infrastructure is designed to support the company's LPG marketing activities, which include:

- purchasing LPG products in bulk at major pipeline terminal points, storage locations and refineries;
- transporting LPG via common carrier pipelines, railcars and trucks to the company's terminals or third-party facilities, for subsequent resale to wholesale customers; and
- exchanging product to other locations to meet contract delivery requirements.

Trucking Operations

Plains Midstream's trucking operations transport crude oil, condensates, diluents, road oils and LPG/NGL products. The company's Canadian trucking services provide short and long haul services throughout B.C., Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Montana and North Dakota, with a fleet of approximately 300 units, including approximately 200 sealed units for sour product. The company's California-based trucking service—Lone Star Trucking—is the largest for-hire liquefied petroleum gas carrier in California and services LPG customers throughout the western United States.





Company History

Plains Midstream Canada is a subsidiary of Plains All American Pipeline L.P., a publicly traded master limited partnership with headquarters in Houston, Texas. Plains All American Pipeline L.P. trades on the New York Stock Exchange under the symbol "PAA."

In 2001, Plains All American Pipeline acquired the Canadian crude oil pipeline, gathering, storage and terminalling assets of Murphy Oil Company Ltd., as well as the assets of CANPET Energy Group, Inc., a privately held Calgary-based Canadian crude oil and LPG marketing company. These assets, that began operating as Plains Marketing Canada, L.P., now operate under the Plains Midstream Canada banner.

The combination of these assets provided a solid foundation for growth in Canada and today Plains Midstream Canada has established a solid and growing presence in the midstream oil and LPG industries.

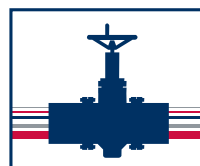
